GENERAL ELECTION, NOVEMBER 3, 2020

The following is the *tentative* schedule of meetings for the 2020 General Election. All meetings will be held at the Supervisor of Elections Election Center, 4132 Okeechobee Road, Fort Pierce.

***Friday, October 9, 2020 – 7:00 am** – *Convene for Logic and Accuracy Pre-Test of voting equipment Vote-by-Mail and Early Voting.* (101.5612, F.S.) – Public Inspection of absentee ballots first 15 minutes, canvass Absentee Ballots.

***Monday, October 12, 2020 – 8:00 am** – Public Inspection of absentee ballots first 15 minutes, canvass Absentee Ballots.

***Thursday, October 15, 2020 – 7:00 am** – Public Inspection of absentee ballots first 15 minutes, canvass Absentee Ballots.

***Monday, October 19, 2020 – 8:00 am** – Public Inspection of absentee ballots first 15 minutes, canvass Absentee Ballots.

***Thursday, October 22, 2020 – 8:00 am** – *Convene for 2nd Logic and Accuracy Pre-Test of voting equipment for Election Day.* (Early Voting and Election Day) (101.5612, F.S.) – Public Inspection of absentee ballots first 15 minutes, canvass Absentee Ballots.

***Monday, October 26, 2020 – 8:00 am** – Public Inspection of absentee ballots first 15 minutes, canvass Absentee Ballots.

***Thursday, October 29, 2020 – 8:00 am** – Public Inspection of absentee ballots first 15 minutes, canvass Absentee Ballots.

***Monday, November 2, 2020 – 7:00 am** – Public Inspection of absentee ballots first 15 minutes, canvass Absentee Ballots.

***Tuesday, November 3, 2020 – 1:00 pm** – Public Inspection of absentee ballots first 15 minutes, canvass Absentee Ballots.

***Thursday, November 5, 2020 – 3:00 pm** – Reconvene to canvass Provisional Ballots and Signature Cure, (No later than 5 pm on the 2nd day after any election 101.048 F.S).

- **Saturday, November 7, 2020 – Noon** – Deadline to submit 1st Unofficial Results to DOS - include the canvass of all ballots including provisional. (No later than noon of the 4th day after a General Election 102.141 F.S.)
- **Thursday, November 12 – 3:00 pm** Deadline for county canvassing boards to file Second Unofficial Results of the General Election with the Department of State, only if recount was conducted. §102.141, F.S. – No later than 3 p.m. of the 9th day after the election.

***Friday, November 13, 2020 – 3:00 pm** – Reconvene to canvass 10 day overseas ballots (Rule 1S-2.013, F.A.C. – Ballot postmarked or signed and dated no later than the date of the federal election and received no later than 10 days from the date of the election), submit Official results certificates and the Report on Conduct of Election **if no recount**.

- **Sunday, November 15 – Noon** - Deadline for county canvassing boards to submit Official Results to the Department of State for the General Election. §102.112, F.S. – By noon on the 12th day following the election.

Wednesday, November 19, 2020– 10:00 am - Reconvene to complete the voting system audit and for the results to be made public unless manual recount undertaken pursuant to §102.166, F.S. §101.591, F.S.; Rule 1S-5.026, F.A.C. – No later than 11:59 p.m. on the 7th day following certification of the election by the county canvassing board.

Scheduled in the event of a Machine or Manual Recount
NO MEETING UNLESS NOTIFIED

TBD – Reconvene for Logic and Accuracy Pre-Test of Voting equipment (101.5612, FS) and conduct a Machine Recount if ordered, (102.141(7) FS). The County Canvassing Board or the State Canvassing Commission responsible for certifying the results of the vote shall order a machine recount.

Manual Recount (102.166 FS) – Will follow the completion of machine recount if needed.

In accordance with the Sunshine Laws of Florida, all Canvassing Board meetings are open to the public. Anyone with a disability requiring accommodation to attend this meeting should contact the St. Lucie County Risk Manager at (772) 462-1783 or TTD (772) 462-1429/8.

If any person decides to appeal any decision made with respect to any matter considered at the meetings or hearings of any board, committee, commission, agency, council or advisory group, that person will need a record of the proceedings and that, for such purpose, may need to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceedings is made, which record should include the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based. Upon the request of any party to the proceedings, individuals testifying during a hearing will be sworn in. Any party to the proceeding will be granted an opportunity to cross-examine any individual testifying during a hearing upon request.
