“At the polls, wear a face mask, stay 6 feet apart in line, and wash your hands frequently. Please be patient at the polls, as social distancing may cause longer lines. In addition, voters may wear gloves or bring their own black ballpoint pen (markers are not allowed) as additional safety precautions.

“Don’t wait until the last minute, if you’re not already registered to vote, register now. If you haven’t requested a Vote By Mail ballot, do it now.
